BOND ORDINANCE NO. 17-2006 - PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Sobel stated that Bond Ordinance No. 17-2006, introduced and passed on first reading by title on June 20, 2006 and published according to law, is now being taken up for further consideration and public hearing. Affidavit of publication of this ordinance in the Asbury Park Press and Courier Newspaper of June 22, 2006 will be submitted and it is noted that a copy of the ordinance has been posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building and that copies were available to the general public upon request.

Thereupon the Clerk read the aforementioned ordinance by title, "BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS IN CONNECTION WITH THE SOUTH RIVER METALS REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF ABERDEEN, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$600,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE TO BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS"
