Mr. Huza stated he has two items to comment on. Department of Transportation Route 34 Sidewalk Improvements, in 1993 Adeline Arnold received grant for trees along Route 34 he hopes the landscaping is taken care of and caution is taken when work is being done.

Mr. Huza stated in August, 2008 the Environmental Board address the Council regarding what is in our garbage, 63% of trash is paper and co mingled items and only 37% is actual garbage. The Township could save \$419,704 with more recycling. The Environmental Board will read the Recycling Ordinance and make their presentation at the next meeting.

Mr. Daly stated there are no crosswalk and no sidewalks on Route 34 to park at the commuter lot. There are only three cars that are parking on Irongate, that is it.

Ms. Sterling stated it is a big problem when the leaves can not be picked up.

Mr. Huza stated in Cliffwood Beach there is a Township park and parking lot (fisherman's lot). On March 11<sup>th</sup> fishing starts. In the fall, cars were ticketed in the lot when park was closed. Mr. Huza asked to exempt the parking restriction for this lot, it is a good fishing spot and fishermen are out all hours. Also, the horseshoe crab count is done in the evening.

Joe Criscuolo will look into this with the Deputy Police Chief.
