Diane Dabulas stated we looked into a Parking Authority to see if it is feasible. Had a meeting with Police Chief, problem is funds to support. Also discussion to have all streets in area with two hour parking. All streets will be the same. This seems to be a viable option.

Mr. Fitzgerald stated it is his understanding Bank and Water Street Roads are not scheduled to be worked on until 2012. You might want to have another look at drainage and encroachments on street. There is a Township Truck that goes on Bank Street everyday and fills up water, he doesn't feel the road can handle this.

Councilman Lauro stated it is the water vac, jets out the lines so there is no rusty water.

Mr. Fitzgerald asked if they can go to other areas.

Joe Criscuolo stated he will talk to the Public Works Director. They are probably doing work in the area.
