HEARING OF THE CITIZENS/CORRESPONDENCE AND PETITIONS

Mayor Sobel asked any member of the public wishing to be heard to come forward and to state their name and address.

Mr. Aljian stated he lives in the "I" Section and we have had an ongoing issue with regards to water mains. The water main breaks and it keeps breaking. Is there some means by which the Council can lend its support by informing the people responsible for this improvement that this consistent failures of the watermain need to be addressed. Patchwork is not a solution.

Mayor Sobel stated Stratmore was developed over a three year period, the water system is over 40 years old, over the last few years they are breaking at an alarming rate. Last year in the "I" section had problems, it takes a few months for New Jersey American Water Company to get approval from the County to make the repairs and replace the mains. We worked with the County and NJAWC to push it through and we got it done in a matter of weeks. We are in constant contact with NJAWC.

Mr. Lauro stated "A" section had a lot of repairs and also the "C", they are replacing the

mains and will be moving up to the “T” section.

Mr. Aljian stated the other issue, when you are coming down Ivy Hill to Lloyd Road, the traffic at intersection is terrible. Mr. Aljian witness a near catastrophe. Is there away to fix this, it needs attention.

Mayor Sobel stated we brought it to the attention of the County every year. I don't know what they are waiting for. We will renew our request once again.
