

**ABERDEEN TOWNSHIP COUNCIL WORKSHOP MEETING  
TUESDAY, JUNE 23, 2009**

Mayor Sobel called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and stated that notice of this meeting has been posted and published in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Establishing a Green Team Advisory Committee: The Sustainable Jersey certification program requires that a Green Team Advisory committee be established by adoption of a resolution by the Township Council. The Green Team will consist of seven members appointed by resolution. Councilman Drapkin asked if we are ready to give permits for Solar Panels. Diane stated any application with solar panels that go to Maxine are sent to CME Assoc. for review. The Green Team Advisory Committee will hopefully be able to help. A straw poll vote was unanimously in favor of bringing this resolution to tonight's public meeting.

Proposing Additional Monmouth-Ocean-Middlesex Passenger Rail Alternatives: This resolution supports seeking other alternatives. Council opted to pull from tonight's agenda to look into further and to check with the County to see what the costs are and what funding they have.

2009/2010 Liquor License Renewal: Three additional liquor licenses (Gallos Wine and Beer, GWR Corp and Bruno's Wine Liquor and General Store) are presented to Council for renewal. All paperwork has been completed and Tax Clearance Certificates have been received and no complaints to the Police Department. A straw poll vote was unanimously in favor of bringing this resolution to tonight's public meeting.

Joe Criscuolo stated we did another budget review with Tom Fallon, Township Auditor. Since the management submitted their budgets in November, \$539,134 has been cut from that budget.

Mr. Criscuolo stated a resident on Irongate would like to extend the No Parking. There

are currently 44 residents that live on that street. There are two commuter cars parking on Irongate. Mr. Criscuolo will send out a survey to the residents on the block.

Mr. Criscuolo stated he met with the DEP last week, we like to have written documentation where they are with the South River Metals site. We can look for money for the follow up phases.

Mr. Criscuolo stated he received a letter from a resident commending Joann Huza in the Tax Assessor office.

Mr. Criscuolo stated he will be going to NJ Transit to discuss the official bus stops along Lloyd Road. There are ten (10) bus stops along Lloyd Road.

Mayor Sobel asked about the speeding on Wilson Avenue.

Mr. Criscuolo stated we looked at the sign situation, the next time we do striping, we will put the speed limit in the roadway. There are not many spots to put the speed wagon on Wilson Avenue where it will be effective.

Mr. Criscuolo stated Anchor Glass is being used as a warehouse. Approximately, 30,000 watermelons were stored in Anchor Glass, and 10,000 began to rot. They were issued notices of violation. We have been watching them very closely.

Councilman Perry asked who was issued the summons, the owner, landlord or tenant.

Mr. Criscuolo stated the tenant.

Councilman Perry stated why not owner. It is the owner's ultimate responsibility. It should be the owner.

Councilman Raymond made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Drapkin and unanimously concurred by Council.
