

**ABERDEEN TOWNSHIP COUNCIL WORKSHOP MEETING
TUESDAY, AUGUST 4, 2009**

Mayor Sobel called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and stated that notice of this meeting has been posted and published in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Fees for Copies of Police Videos: An ordinance is required to incorporate a fee for the video copies of the cameras in the police vehicles. The Police Chief is requesting a fee of \$5.00 for a digital video. Council questioned the fee amount. Mr. Criscuolo explained that Chief Powers took a survey of towns in the area and the \$5.00 appeared to be the fee we can charge per State Statute. Mr. Criscuolo stated he will have Chief Powers in the next meeting to explain. A straw poll vote was unanimously in favor of introducing ordinance at tonight's public meeting.

Identity Theft: Diane Dabulas requested the Identity Theft Resolution be tabled.

Bus Stop Locations: Mr. Criscuolo had a meeting with New Jersey Transit to go over bus stops in Aberdeen along Lloyd Road and Route 34. It was agreed to delete bus stops along Lloyd Road, westbound, on the northerly side at Idlewild Lane and along Route 34, northbound on the easterly side at Bechstein Drive. It was also agreed to add bus stop along Route 34, northbound on the easterly side thereof at Bechstein Drive. A straw poll vote was unanimously in favor of introducing ordinance at tonight's public meeting.

Mr. Criscuolo stated the results of the Irongate Lane survey of commuter parking and possible parking limitations: Yes – 4; No – 9; Maybe – 1; Did not respond – 30.

Mr. Criscuolo stated the NJ DEP workplan for the Zobel site deemed complete. The Fire Chief deemed the trailer on property was unsafe and was a hazard. It has been secured to the satisfaction of the Fire Chief.

Councilman Perry asked if we own Zobel property, can we take it down like South River

Metals.

Mr. Criscuolo stated yes we do own it and we did take it down but unlike South River Metals there is no value in the material. Mr. Criscuolo will be checking on possible temporary parking at this site.

Councilman Vinci made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilman Raymond and unanimously concurred by Council.
