Ms. Person stated she has lived there for 12 years now, has there been a problem.

Mr. Coren stated there was an instance where the problem was found. They also do go around town and check the streets.

Mayor Sobel stated he doesn't want to be in a position where we have to wait for an instance to determine whether or not there is a proper turning radius. We look to our professionals to make that determination. We have an obligation to take action.

Ms. Person stated she agrees with that, but has a concern with Highfield Avenue being unfairly targeted. Has the emergency department surveyed all the streets.

Mr. Coren stated each instance is dealt with on its own merit as it comes to the attention of the public safety officials. Mr. Coren suggested that the hearing be closed and a meeting with the residents and public safety officials be made to hear what they have to say so that there is broader understanding.

Councilman Raymond stated we had this problem in the beach because the size of the equipment is getting longer, higher, wider. So many things have to be taken into consideration.

Mr. Coren stated what is important is to gain understanding.

Ms. Person how is the no parking going to be enforced. How do we handle UPS, lawn services or renovation parking.

Mr. Coren stated it is a matter of unattended vehicles.

Ms. Person asked about the turning radius being enforced differently. She checked all the blocks around the neighborhood and most are 2 hour parking because being so close to the train station.

Mr. Coren stated the facts may be better addressed at a meeting with the residents of Highfield Ave and the public safety officials. Mr. Coren stated this will not get passed until after the meeting.

Mr. McCarthy stated the public hearing will be left open. You will get the answers you need at the meeting. If you don't like it you will get a chance to come back to the Council and state your opinion.

RESOLUTION NO. 2005-111 - RESOLUTION TO PROTECT OUR CHILDREN

WHEREAS, the children of United States of America have been victimized and otherwise put at risk by child sexual predators; and

WHEREAS, the children of the State of New Jersey require and deserve the greatest protection the law will allow from child sexual predators; and

WHEREAS, the Governor and New Jersey has enacted N.J.S.A. 2C:7-1 et. seq. the Registration of Community Notification Law also known as Megan’s Law to create a State registry of sexual offenders as well as community notification procedures; and

WHEREAS, the registration and notification procedures implemented by Megan’s Law have not completely abated the threats to our citizens and the child of this State by repeat sexual offenders who have been convicted and classified as Tier III offenders; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Township of Aberdeen wish to ensure that steps are taken to provide further protect to our most vulnerable citizens, the children of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Township of Aberdeen wish to pass this resolution “Resolution to Protect our Children” calling for life imprisonment for certain offenders by unanimous consent; and

WHEREAS, by passing this resolution the Mayor and Council of the Township of Aberdeen requests that each municipal government in the State of New Jersey likewise pass this resolution to protect our children.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Aberdeen that it hereby calls on the New Jersey State Legislature to review and release and registration procedures imposed by Megan’s Law for Tier III sexual offenders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we do ask our legislature to review the guidelines surrounding sentencing of convicted Tier III sex offenders and sentence these offenders to life in prison.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Governor, both Houses of the Legislature, State of New Jersey, New Jersey State League of Municipalities and each municipal governing body in the County of Monmouth.
