### **HEARING OF THE CITIZENS/CORRESPONDENCE AND PETITIONS**

President Pro Tem Perry asked any member of the public wishing to be heard to come forward and to state their name and address.

Mr. Geniton stated that Treasure Lake is in terrible disrepair. It is 6 inches deep, pipes have collapsed and residents live around the lake.

Mr. Coren stated there are environmental issues. If we dredge the lake there will be disposal issues. In 1985 there was a hurricane that threw salt water into the lake. What you are referring to is a natural process based on the drainage. Question is whether or not to restore the lake to the eco system that existed there before. There are agencies that may want to work with the town to bring back Treasure Lake, it is not too late for the eco system to be reestablished.

Amee Fontanetta

Ms. Fontanetta stated she is at the top of the street. There is a water flow from the top of the street to the lake. The elements that are coming down are oily, muddy.

Mr. Coren stated that is exactly what he is referring too. Mr. Coren explained the new stormwater regulations and the ordinances adopted at the last meeting which can help a situation as this.

President Pro Tem Perry stated there are two issues, to evaluate Treasure Lake and see what is necessary to restore the eco system that naturally existed and the other is identify violators which can be done through stormwater management regulations.

Mr. Coren stated what has to be done is it becomes a long term capital issue for the town. Mr. Coren stated he will talk to the Township Engineer about this issue.

Ms. Fontanetta asked about the Bayshore Project where the town was allotted money to restore the seawall.

Mr. Coren stated in the mid 70's the town spent \$4 million to put the seawall up. Two years after the seawall was done there was a northeaster that came by that waste a half a million cubic yards of sand away from the seawall. We were in the process of putting sand back on the beach when hurricane Gloria came up the coast. I stood watching the sand migrate into Keyport harbor. We have gone to Congressman Palone and others and requested that the Federal Government take

responsibility for the seawall because of its impact on the region. At one time it was part of the Army Corp of Engineers capital improvement projects. Like many things in budgets, it was cut.

Mr. Magella stated I could understand it is going to be a long process. I have been there for seven years and I see what is happening each year.

Mr. Coren stated he would like to begin dealing with this in a process point of view. I will ask the engineers for a proposal to do a study on Treasure Lake and start the process. Then find other agencies to help.
