PRESS RELEASE

The Aberdeen Township Police made the following arrests January 31, 2012 through February 6, 2012:

- James B. Williams, 28, Greenwood Avenue, Aberdeen, was arrested by P.O. Raymond Campbell for contempt of court and obstruction of justice following a motor vehicle stop on Greenwood Avenue on January 31st at approximately 11:30 PM. Mr. Williams was wanted on contempt warrants out of North Plainfield and Aberdeen municipal courts. He fled into his house, but was apprehended soon thereafter
